Experience Siem Reap, a resort town in northwestern Cambodia, is the gateway to the ruins of Angkor, the seat of the Khmer kingdom from the 9th–15th centuries. Angkor's vast complex of intricate stone buildings includes preserved Angkor Wat, the main temple, which is pictured on Cambodia's flag. Giant, mysterious faces are carved into the Bayon Temple at Angkor Thom. Discovery Phnom Penh, Cambodia's busy capital, sits at the junction of the Mekong and Tonlé Sap rivers. It was a hub for both the Khmer Empire and French colonialists. On its walkable riverfront, lined with parks, restaurants and bars, are the ornate Royal Palace, Silver Pagoda and the National Museum, displaying artifacts from around the country. At the city's heart is the massive, art deco Central Market.

#### SIGHTSEEINGS:



The Royal Palace: is a magnificent example of Khmer architecture, it was built in 1866. You will see the Throne Hall and the Napoleon III Pavilion.



**Silver Pagoda:** is one of the city's most visited sites and offers a display of priceless Buddhist and historical objects. The Pagoda draws its name with more than 5,000 silver tiles, which cover a floor in the temple. The building serves less as a functioning shrine, no monks currently reside here, than a repository of cultural treasures such as the famous Emerald Buddha and many other valuable statues.



National Museum: Located just north of the Royal Palace, the National Museum of Cambodia is housed in a graceful terracotta structure of traditional design (built from 1917 to 1920), with an inviting courtyard garden. The museum is home to the world's finest collection of Khmer sculpture – a millennium's worth and more of masterful Khmer design. The museum comprises four pavilions, facing a pretty garden. Most visitors start left and

continue in a clockwise, chronological direction.



Angkor Wat: The "7th Wonders' of the World". World Heritage Site since 1992, famous for its beauty and splendor. Angkor Wat features the longest continuous bas-relief in the world, which runs along the outer gallery walls and narrates stories from Hindu mythology.




**Ta Prohm Temple:** Built from 1186 and originally known as Rajavihara (Monastery of the King), Ta Prohm was a Buddhist temple dedicated to the mother of Jayavarman VII. It is one of the few temples in the Angkor region where an inscription provides information about the temple's dependents and inhabitants.



South Gate of Angkor Thom: is famous for its series of colossal human faces carved in stone, the impressive Bayon Temple, the Royal Enclosure, Phimeanakas, the Elephant Terrace, the Terrace of the Leper King and the largest as well as the most complete temple of Angkor Wat. This architectural masterpiece was constructed in the 12th century and covers an area of about 210 hectares. We stroll around this massive


edifice, seeing the many galleries with Colums, libraries, pavilions, courtyards and ponds





Kampong Phluck Village: Located within the floodplains of Tonle Sap, Kompong Phluk is a village of tall stilted houses surrounded by serene flooded mangrove forest. A visit to the village provides a good insight into the way of life of the people whose livelihood depends on the ebb and flow of Tonle Sap Lake. Kompong Phluk will appear different depending on the season you visit.







Banteay Srei: Considered by many to be the jewel in the crown of Angkorian art, Banteay Srei is cut from stone of a pinkish hue and includes some of the finest stone carving anywhere on earth. The art gallery of Angkor, Banteay Srei, a Hindu temple dedicated to Shiva, is wonderfully well preserved and many of its carvings are three-dimensional.



Landmine Museum: Established by DIY de-miner Aki Ra, this museum has eye-opening displays on the curse of land mines in Cambodia. The collection includes mines, mortars, guns and weaponry, and there is a mock minefield where visitors can attempt to locate the deactivated mines.

# DAY 01: PHNOM PENH ARRIVAL



Arrive at Phnom Penh International Airport, met & greeted by Tour Guide and transfer to the hotel (Time of checking in is at 14h00).

In the afternoon, visit *Royal Palace* which is actually a number of structures within a pagodastyle compound. Continue with *Silver Pagoda*, one of the city's most visited sites and offers a display of priceless Buddhist and historical objects and *National Museum of Khmer Arts*, one of the world's greatest collections of Khmer cultural material including sculpture, ceramics and ethnographic objects from the prehistoric, pre-Angkorian, Angkorian and post-Angkorian periods. Overnight in Phnom Penh.

After breakfast, we visit *Ta Prohm temple* which is unique in that it has been left largely as it was found: overgrown by jungle trees and vines, with many parts of the temple crumbling to the ground. Continue your trip to visit *The South Gate of Angkor Thom: Bayon Temple, The Royal Enclosure, Phimeanaka, Elephant* and *Leper King Terrace*. Overnight in Siem Reap.

# DAY 04: SIEM REAP TONLE SAP LAKE

After breakfast, we take a trip to *visit an ethnic local village* and take a scenic *boat cruise* on the *Tonle Sap Lake*, the world's largest inland freshwater lake, to see the *Kampong Phluck Village*, a village of tall stilted houses surrounded by serene flooded mangrove forest on the Tonle Sap Lake.

In the afternoon, we visit *Banteay Srei temple* which is best viewed in the warm afternoon light. The temple is constructed of pink sandstone, which is seen nowhere else in Angkor. Then, stop at the *Landmine Museum* which promotes mine awareness and education. Desembark and back to Siem Reap for overnight.
