

## 3 Days ISTANBUL PERGAMON - KUSADASI - EPHEBUS – PAMUKKALE

*Tour Code : EPS10*

*Tour Days : Everyday ( According the available weather conditions )*

*Highlights : Izmir – Pergamon – Kusadasi –Ephesus – Pamukkale.*

### ITINERARY

#### DAY 1 – Pergamon – İzmir - Kusadasi

Early Morning Flight from Istanbul to Izmir Airport ( Istanbul to Izmir direct flights every day. )

Arrival and meeting with guide at the Izmir Airport just outside the arrival's gate with a sign bearing your name.

Departure to Pergamon 135 Km – 1.45 hour.

**Pergamon** was one of the important settlements of Misya region in ancient times. Bergama's history dates back to the seventh century BC. It was the capital of the Kingdom of Pergamon in 282-133 BC.

The Temple of Zeus, the Temple of Dionysus, the Temple of Athena, the Temple of Demeter, the famous Pergamon Library of 200,000 rolls, theater, gymnasium, king palaces, Traian Temple, waterways, fountains, cisterns and arsenals are world famous monuments built at the hill.

The Acropolis, which is the administrative center of the city, The Altar of Zeus, excavated during the Bergama excavations, is now on display at the Pergamon Museum in Berlin. Bergama Theater is the world's steepest theater (about 68 degrees). Capacity 10,000 people.

We have a lunch in a local restaurant

**the Red Basilica** (St. Johns Church). It is one of the sites of the **Seven Churches** of revalion.

The enclosures of the antique structures were placed on the system. With a free application they download to their smartphones, visitors can watch the 360-degree virtual imagery of the Red Hall, the Temple of Zeus, the Temple of Athena, and the temple of Zeus-Asklepios two thousand years ago.

At the end of the tour we departure to Kusadasi 198 Km 2,45 Hour. Overnight at hotel in Kusadasi ( B.L.D)

#### DAY 2 – Ephesus – Pamukkale

After breakfast driving to Ephesus from Kusadasi We visiting Ephesus - one of the best-preserved classical cities in the eastern Mediterranean and a great example of Roman architecture. When you walk on marbel street of Ephesus like by Cleopatra and Mark Antony, feel privilege your selve.

Within Ephesus you will be seeing **Harbour Street**, the Marble Street, **Ephesus Grand Theater** which is capacity seating for 25,000 persons, the gate of Mihridates and Mazues, Commercial Agora, latrina, the Scolastica Baths, , the **Hercules gate**, the famous **Celsus Library**, Trajan Fountain, Curetes Street, Polio Fountain, Memnius Monument, the Temple of Domitian, **Temple of Hadrian**, the Prytaneion, the State Agora and Odeon. End of Ephesus Ancient city tour visit Artemision Temple

**Temple of Artemis** : Temple of Artemis is one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. In a flat area of first ancient Ephesus, centuries later it became a big bog. Because of Meander river aluvions destroyed Artemis Temple. Today there are the remains of the foundations of this wonderful hellenistic structure. After being destroyed and rebuilt in the second century, the Temple of Artemis was again demolished by earthquakes and was finally dismissed from the Goths. The most beautiful marble remains of this Artemision temple are on display at the British Museum in London since the

long years.

Lunch break in a local restaurant. After Lunch, visiting the House of Virgin Maria.

**House of Virgin Mary** is located on the top of the "Bulbul" mountain 8 km from Ephesus, Virgin Mary may have spent her last years at the Bulbul hill. She have come in this area together with Saint John, who spent several years in the area to spread Christianity. During the visiting you may feel the mystical holly atmosphere around Virgin Maria's house area.

The end of the tour visit leather fabric outlet magazin on request.

At the end of the tour moves to Pamukkale 200 Km / 3 Hours. Arrivel and overnight in your hotel at Pamukkale ( B.L.D )

### DAY 3 – Pamukkale – Istanbul

After breakfast **Hierapolis tour** is starting, you discover the travertine terraces and the Hierapolis by passing the Roman Gate, the ancient Pamukkale Theater, the path between the heroic tombs. Each tomb tells a story and is a small work of art. The travertine terraces in Pamukkale fly with carbon dioxide and carbon monoxide since thermal waters flowing for millions of years have passed through air. Ancient Cleopatra thermal pool entrance is extra . We're having lunch in a local restaurant . After lunch drive to Laodicea 5 Km.

**Laodicea tour**, we are visiting the ancient city of Laodicea. Visit this church where one of the Holy Seven Church is here. Excavations still continue in Laodicea and an ancient city as beautiful as Ephesus is emerging. Ancient theaters, marble paths and row columns on both sides of this road, recently uncovered basilica ruins, antique stone water pipes, temple, agora, monumental fountain. ( B.L. )

At the end of the tour Transfer to Denizli Cardak airport 62 Km / 45 minutes or Izmir Airport 235 Km 3 Hours. Take the evening flight and landing to Istanbul meet with your guide transfer to your hotel.
