Day 1 (Tuesday)	7:30	Meet at SM Duty Free.	
	07:30-10:30	Transfer to Cheongnamdae.	
	10:30-12:00	<p><b>The Cheongnamdae</b> is a presidential vacation villa located near Daecheong Dam in Cheongwon-gu, Chungcheongbuk-do.</p> <p>There were four presidential villas including the one in Gimhae in the past. During Kim Young-sam's administration, however, all but Cheongnamdae were closed. Cheongnamdae, which had been closed to the public for twenty years, was finally opened to the public on April 18, 2003 by former president Roh Moo-hyun. Visitors can view a music fountain inside the ecological wetland garden (990m<sup>2</sup>), hike a 3.3km mountain trail and visit the Hoban Promenade (8km), or simply take a pleasant walk along a beautiful trail, and enjoy the scenic landscape of Daecheongho Lake.</p>	
	12:20-13:20	Lunch at Local Restaurant with local dishes	
	13:20-14:30	<p><b>Munui Cultural Properties Site</b> offers overlooks of Daecheongho Lake. Attracting many visitors, the place was created to preserve and promote the local traditional culture of Cheongwon (Chungcheongbuk-do); it is a great place to learn about local history, culture, and arts.</p>	
15:20-16:30	<p>Built in the 14th year of Silla King Jin-Heung's reign, <b>Beopjusa Temple</b> is located on Songnisan Mountain. What stands today are the remnants of rebuilt monuments through left over from the lengthy and arduous process. When you enter the temple, the yellow earthen road will catch your eye. The road itself leads to the Orisup Trail, and there will be a nature study trail beside it. Pass the Orisup trail, through thick pine trees, and you will come across the main gate of the temple. There is a large rock with a hole in the middle beside the main gate. You can drink spring water that comes out of the hole. Inside the temple you can see Palsangjeon, Pavilion which is a wooden building shaped like a tower.</p>

	10:00-11:00	<b>Gongju National Museum</b> manages and preserves the cultural treasures excavated from northern Chungcheongnam-do. It takes special care of cultural treasures discovered at the Muryeong Royal Tomb in 1971. You can view most of the relics from the tomb at the museum. The current buildings were specifically built to exhibit these relics. Gongju Museum has excavated many other relics and sites. The exhibit hall constitutes of 2 parts. It exhibits over 1000 relics, including National Treasure No.19 and No.4.	
	11:10-12:10	<b>Gongju Gongsanseong Fortress [UNESCO World Heritage]</b> , a mountain castle which was established during the Baekje Period (234-678). The castle is about 2.5km long, and there are two ways of touring the castle. One way is to start from the parking lot, pass the west gate, Geumseoru, and walk along the cement road. The other way is to turn left at the beginning of the cement road and walk along the top of the castle, which is called Sanseong Road.

	13:30-14:30	<b>Songsan-ri Tombs and Royal Tomb of King Muryeong.</b>
