Day 1	<p><b>&gt;Arrival at Incheon International Airport</b> <b>Transfer to Gimpo International Airport to Jeju International Airport</b> <b>Domestic Flight to Jeju</b> <b>Mysterious Road</b> <b>Yongduam Dragon Head Rock</b></p> <p>Situated to the north of Jeju City, Yongduam was created by strong winds and waves over thousands of years. However, there are plenty of other stories of how it came to be. One legend has it that a dragon stealing precious jade from Mt. Halla was shot down by an arrow from the mountain deity. When he fell down on Yongduam, his body immediately sank into the ocean and his head rapidly froze looking at the sky. Another legend has it that a white horse, who dreamed of being a dragon and ascending to the sky, came to be caught by a soldier and froze into the rock.</p>
Day 2 [B,L,D]	<p><b>Seopjikoji</b> Seopjikoji was the filming site of "Gingko Bed," "The Uprising," "One Thousand and One Nights" and other Korean TV dramas. Nearby attractions include Jeju Folk Village and Udo Island as well.</p> <p><b>Sungeup Folk Village</b> Cultural properties in the folk village have been handed down from generation to generation and include treasures such as residential houses, Confucian shrines and schools, ancient government offices, stone statues, large millstones (pulled by horses or ox), fortress ruins, and stone monuments.</p> <p><b>Jeju Mandarin Museum</b> Nestled at the foot of Wollabong Peak in Seogwipo-si, the Citrus Museum is a place dedicated to the local citrus, Jeju's specialty product. The museum displays items related to the history and culture of citrus and the citrus industry. Visitors can also get a glimpse of Jeju residents' lives through the different exhibits.</p> <p><b>Jusangjeolli Cliff</b> Jusangjeolli are stone pillars piled up along the coast and is a designated cultural monument of Jeju Island. Jusangjeolli Cliff was formed when the lava from Hallasan Mountain erupted into the sea of Jungmun. They are rock pillars shaped like cubes or hexagons of various sizes and almost seem as if stone masons had carved them out.</p> <p><b>Cheonjiyeon Waterfall</b> The water at Cheonjiyeon Falls, meaning "sky connected with land," appears to fall from the heavens, giving the falls its name. Take a walk along the subtropical path towards the Cheonjiyeon Falls for a kilometer and you will be able to hear the magnificent sound of the water falling. The waterfall is 22m high, 12m wide and 20m in depth.</p>

<p><b>Day 3</b> <b>[B,L,D]</b></p>	<p><b>Domestic Flight from Jeju International Airport to Gimpo International Airport</b> <b>Nami Island including Ferry</b></p> <p>Namiseom Island is 63 km away from Seoul in the direction of Chuncheon, and is famous for its beautiful tree lined roads. The island is 30 minutes away from Chuncheon and an hour away from the suburbs of Seoul. Since it is not far from Seoul, many couples and families come to visit.</p> <p><b>Daegwalryung Sheep Farm</b></p> <p>The farm features more than 200 sheep. The first thing that comes into view as you approach the farm are the herds of white sheep roaming on the green plains.</p>
<p><b>Day 4</b> <b>[B,L,D]</b></p>	<p><b>Mt. Seorak National Park including Cable Car</b></p> <p>Seoraksan Mountain, the highest amid the Taebaeksanmaek Mountain Range, boasts beautiful landscape and scenery all year round.</p> <p><b>Gwongeumsung Fortress</b></p> <p>Gwongeumseong Fortress is the site of a castle ruins located on Seoraksan Mountain, and it is also known as Mt. Onggeumsan Castle, or Toto Castle. It is located on the steep Dolsan Mountain of Seoraksan Sogongwon area.</p> <p><b>Shinheungsa Temple</b></p> <p>Sinheungsa is a temple which used to be called Hyangseongsa. On the path to Sinheungsa, there is a great bronze statue called Bronze Jwabal Statue, which is well over 10 meters high. Just beyond the statue, which is on a granite terrace, there is a bridge to the right called Hyeonsugyo, which was newly built for crossing the ravine.</p> <p><b>Jeongdongjin Beach</b></p> <p>Visitors can further appreciate the beauty of nature by checking out the Sculpture (Sunrise) Park and Heonhwaro, located to the south of the park.</p> <p><b>Transfer to Seoul</b></p>
<p><b>Day 5</b> <b>[B,L,D]</b></p>	<p><b>Deoksu Palace (Deoksugung)</b></p> <p>Located at the corner of Seoul's busiest downtown intersection, Deoksugung Palace is famous for its elegant stone-wall road. It is also the only palace that sits alongside a series of western style buildings that add to the uniqueness of the surrounding scenery.</p> <p><b>Ginseng Showroom &amp; Amethyst Factory</b></p> <p><b>Seaweed Museum with Hanbok Traditional Costume Experience</b></p> <p><b>Tongin Market with Traditional Coins worth KRW 5,000</b></p> <p>Tongin Market consists of 75 stores, most of which are restaurants and grocery stores. People can use traditional coins to buy goods.</p> <p><b>Duty Free</b></p> <p><b>Myeongdong</b></p> <p>Many brand name shops and department stores line the streets and alleys. Common products for sale include clothes, shoes, and accessories. Unlike Namdaemun or Dongdaemun, many designer brands are sold in Myeong-dong.</p>
