

# 6 Days Seoulites, Jeju Island & Suwon

<b>Day 1</b>	<p><b>&gt;Arrival at Incheon International Airport</b> <b>Transfer to Gimpo International Airport to Jeju International Airport [Domestic Flight]</b> <b>Mysterious Road</b> <b>Yongduam Dragon Head Rock</b> Situated to the north of Jeju City, Yongduam was created by strong winds and waves over thousands of years. However, there are plenty of other stories of how it came to be. One legend has it that a dragon stealing precious jade from Mt. Halla was shot down by an arrow from the mountain deity. When he fell down on Yongduam, his body immediately sank into the ocean and his head rapidly froze looking at the sky. Another legend has it that a white horse, who dreamed of being a dragon and ascending to the sky, came to be caught by a soldier and froze into the rock.</p>
<b>Day 2</b> <b>[B,L,D]</b>	<p><b>Seopjikoji</b> Seopjikoji was the filming site of "Gingko Bed," "The Uprising," "One Thousand and One Nights" and other Korean TV dramas. Nearby attractions include Jeju Folk Village and Udo Island as well. <b>Sungeup Folk Village</b> Cultural properties in the folk village have been handed down from generation to generation and include treasures such as residential houses, Confucian shrines and schools, ancient government offices, stone statues, large millstones (pulled by horses or ox), fortress ruins, and stone monuments. <b>Jusangjeolli Cliff</b> Jusangjeolli are stone pillars piled up along the coast and is a designated cultural monument of Jeju Island. Jusangjeolli Cliff was formed when the lava from Hallasan Mountain erupted into the sea of Jungmun. They are rock pillars shaped like cubes or hexagons of various sizes and almost seem as if stone masons had carved them out. <b>Cheonjiyeon Waterfall</b> The water at Cheonjiyeon Falls, meaning "sky connected with land," appears to fall from the heavens, giving the falls its name. Take a walk along the subtropical path towards the Cheonjiyeon Falls for a kilometer and you will be able to hear the magnificent sound of the water falling. The waterfall is 22m high, 12m wide and 20m in depth.</p>
<b>Day 3</b> <b>[B,L,D]</b>	<p><b>Camellia Hill</b> Camellia Hill is a camellia arboretum that was created on a plot of land in Sangchang-ri, Andeok-myeon, Jeju-do that spans 172,000 square meters. The arboretum is home to 6,000 camellia trees of 500 different species including species that are known to produce the world's largest and earliest blossoms. <b>Yakchunsa Temple</b> The architectural style of Yakcheonsa Temple is reminiscent of that of Buddhist temples of the early Joseon Dynasty. Measuring an impressive 30m high and spanning a total area of 3,305 meters squared, it is the largest temple in the East.</p>

	<p><b>Mandarin Museum</b> Nestled at the foot of Wollabong Peak in Seogwipo-si, the Citrus Museum is a place dedicated to the local citrus, Jeju's specialty product. The museum displays items related to the history and culture of citrus and the citrus industry. Visitors can also get a glimpse of Jeju residents' lives through the different exhibits.</p> <p><b>Jeju Herb Garden</b> Jeju Herb Garden, also called Herb Dongsan, is a place where you can find rest and refreshment for your body and mind. This special garden is 16.3 acres big (20,000 pyung) and has all kinds of herbs and wildflowers for you to enjoy while walking along its many paths.</p>
<p><b>Day 4</b> <b>[B,L,D]</b></p>	<p><b>Transfer to Jeju International Airport to Gimpo International Airport [Domestic Flight]</b></p> <p><b>Suwon Hwasung Castle [UNESCO World Heritage]</b> Hwaseong Fortress is an impressive structure from the latter part of the Joseon Dynasty (1392-1910) and the official fortress of Suwon-si, Gyeonggi-do. The fortress (constructed from 1794 to 1796) was built as a display of the King's filial piety towards his father Jangheonseja and to build a new pioneer city with its own economic power.</p> <p><b>Hoam Museum</b> The museum displays over 15,000 works of art that come from all periods of Korea's history and date all the way back to the pre-historic age. Around 100 of Korea's national treasures are on display here, along with Buddhist art, calligraphy, folk paintings, and an excellent collection of ceramics. The exhibitions is spread over two floors and located in a building constructed in the traditional Hanok style.</p> <p><b>Seoul N Tower</b> Seoul Tower opened to the public on October 15, 1980 and has since become a major tourist attraction. The 236.7 meter tower sits atop Namsan Mountain (243m). The observatory offers panoramic views of Seoul and the surrounding areas.</p>
<p><b>Day 5</b> <b>[B,L,D]</b></p>	<p><b>Deoksu Palace (Deoksugung)</b> Located at the corner of Seoul's busiest downtown intersection, Deoksugung Palace is famous for its elegant stone-wall road. It is also the only palace that sits alongside a series of western style buildings that add to the uniqueness of the surrounding scenery.</p> <p><b>Ginseng Showroom &amp; Amethyst Factory</b></p> <p><b>Seaweed Museum with Hanbok Traditional Costume Experience</b></p> <p><b>Tongin Market with Traditional Coins worth KRW 5,000</b> Tongin Market consists of 75 stores, most of which are restaurants and grocery stores. People can use traditional coins to buy goods.</p> <p><b>Duty Free</b></p> <p><b>Myeongdong</b> Many brand name shops and department stores line the streets and alleys. Common products for sale include clothes, shoes, and accessories. Unlike Namdaemun or Dongdaemun, many designer brands are sold in Myeong-dong.</p>
