#### 5 Days Yangon - Bagan - Mandalay - Yangon



Arrival at Yangon International Airport. Welcome by our well-experienced guide. Upon arrival, Visit to City center landmark Sule Pagoda, Mahabandoola Park and downtown of Yangon with remarkable sites of Colonial Buildings & City Hall. Visit to Chaukhtat Gyi, the biggest colossal reclining image in Myanmar.Lunch at local restaurant. After lunch visit to Bogyoke Market, the most famous for shopping with full of Myanmar arts, Handicrafts, Lacquerware & Jewelleries.

In the afternoon, visit to Shwedagon Pagoda - described by Somerset Maugham: "The Shwedagon rose superb, glistening with its gold, like a sudden hope in the dark night of the soul of which the mystics write, glistening against the fog and smoke of the thriving city." This massive bell-shaped stupa rises nearly 100 meters above its hill-top surroundings. Wander through this magnificent structure and its courtyards, stupas, bells, temples, and Buddha images, and see religious and secular visitors from all parts of the globe. Shwedagon has become the symbol of Myanmar. Over-night at Central Hotel or similar in Yangon.

## Day 2: Yangon-Bagan (Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)





Early morning transfer to the airport for morning flight to Bagan. Arrive Bagan and visit. Bagan, one of Asia's most popular archaeological destinations and one out of two most pre-eminent religious old cities in South East Asia. The sightseeing starts with a visit to; Pyathatgyi (Pyathadar) Temple. Pyathatgyi is one of the few remaining "double cave" monasteries and was built in the first half of the 13th century. Dhamanyangyi Temple - built by King Narathu in 12th century which displayed the finest brickwork in Bagan. Sulamani Temple. In the afternoon visit to the lacquer ware factory followed by a visit to local village. After that visit to Ananda Temple – one of the masterpieces surviving and remaining in Bagan and considered to be in the Mon architecture style; Thatbyinnyu Temple- the highest building on the Bagan plain. Then visit to the hill to watch the sunset. Dinner at local restaurant and overnight at Regency Hotel or similar in Bagan.

Day 3: Bagan- Mandalay (Breakfast/ Lunch/Dinner)







Breakfast at hotel. Then transfer to the airport for the flight to Mandalay. When you arrive at Mandalay airport, drive to Mandalay. On the way visit Amarapura sightseeing ( it is a former capital whose name means 'City of Immortality' . First, visit a silk weaving workshop which produces exquisite handmade products. After touring this tranquil site, continue to U Bein Bridge for a walk along this 200 year-old teak bridge. The bridge was constructed of 984 teak posts that were once part of the deserted Inwa Palace and it is 1.2 kilometers in length making it the world' s longest teak span. Then transfer to "Mahagand hayonMonastery" Where more than a thousand monks live and study the Buddha scripture. If time permit you will have the opportunity to observe the monks having their last meal of the day . Then proceed to Mandalay. Mandalay is the last capital of Myanmar and that make her to be the best place to see all the traditional arts and crafts. Start visiting gold leaf making work-place and see how the gold leaf is being made by hand in a traditional way.

"Mahamuni Pagoda" the great facial of Buddha and it was brought to Mandalay from Rakhine State during the reign of King Bodawpaya in 1784. The image is completely covered with 15cm thick gold. "Gold Leaf Making Workshop" you can see how to make gold leaf. The square gold leaf tissues are hand-made in Mandalay. Funitures, shrines, boxes, musical instruments etc are usually covered with gilded relief patterns. "Shwe Nan Daw Monastery" a superb example of an ancient traditional wooden buildingwith intricate carvings. "Kuthodaw Pagoda" make of marble and the "World' s Largest Book" is a 13-acre field of 729 pieces of stone on marble slabs. "Mandalay Hill" A superb panoramic view of the city can be seen from the top Sunset and overview of Mandalay city. After sightseeing, transfer to hotel. Overnight at Hotel Yadanarbon or similar in Mandalay. Meals included: Breakfast, Lunch, and Dinner

Day 4 : Mandalay - Yangon (Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)







Breakfast at hotel. drive to Mingun, the rural village area which is home to the world's largest uncracked ringing bell, the largest brick base Pathodawgyi Pagoda and Myatheindan Pagoda with a distinctive architectural style modeled after the mythical Mount Meru .After exploring the sights in Mingun, we will drive back to Sagaing Hill where you can enjoy the panoramic view at the top of the Hill cover with numerous pagodas and monasteries. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant in Sagaing. Then Silversmiths, Myanmar traditional workshop will be observed. After that transfer to airport for fly back to Yangon. Arrive Yangon and transfer to restaurant for dinner. After dinner transfer to hotel check in. Overnight at Central Hotel or similar in Yangon.

### Day 5 : Yangon departure (Breakfast)

After breakfast at hotel, transfer to Yangon and transfer to airport for departure to your next destination. Meals included: Breakfast
