## 6 Days Yangon - Bagan - Mandalay - Inle - Yangon

Day 1: Yangon arrival and sightseeing (Lunch/Dinner)



Arrival at Yangon International Airport. Welcome by our well-experienced guide. Upon arrival, Visit to City center landmark Sule Pagoda, Mahabandoola Park and downtown of Yangon with remarkable sites of Colonial Buildings & City Hall. Visit to Chaukhtat Gyi, the biggest colossal reclining image in Myanmar. Lunch at local restaurant. After lunch visit to Bogyoke Market, the most famous for shopping with full of Myanmar arts, Handicrafts, Lacquerware & Jewelleries.

In the afternoon, visit to Shwedagon Pagoda - described by Somerset Maugham: "The Shwedagon rose superb, glistening with its gold, like a sudden hope in the dark night of the soul of which the mystics write, glistening against the fog and smoke of the thriving city." This massive bell-shaped stupa rises nearly 100 meters above its hill-top surroundings. Wander through this magnificent structure and its courtyards, stupas, bells, temples, and Buddha images, and see religious and secular visitors from all parts of the globe. Shwedagon has become the symbol of Myanmar. Over-night at hotel in Yangon.

Day 2: Yangon-Bagan (Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)





After breakfast at hotel, transfer to the airport for morning flight to Bagan. Arrive Bagan and visit. Bagan, one of Asia's most popular archaeological destinations and one out of two most pre-eminent religious old cities in South East Asia. The sightseeing starts with a visit to; Pyathatgyi (Pyathadar) Temple. Pyathatgyi is one of the few remaining "double cave" monasteries and was built in the first half of the 13th century. Dhamanyangyi Temple - built by King Narathu in 12th century which displayed the finest brickwork in Bagan. Sulamani Temple. In the afternoon visit to the lacquer ware factory followed by a visit to local village. After that visit to Ananda Temple – one of the masterpieces surviving and remaining in Bagan and considered to be in the Mon architecture style; Thatbyinnyu Temple- the highest building on the Bagan plain. Then visit to the hill to watch the sunset. Dinner at local restaurant and overnight at hotel in Bagan.

## Day 3: Bagan-Mandalay (Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)







After breakfast at hotel, transfer to the airport for morning flight to Mandalay. Arrive to Mandalay and meet with guide at the airport. On the way Amarapura sightseeing, "U Bein Bridge" built in 1782 at the time when Amarapura was Royal capital and 1.200 meter long over 150 years old, crossing the Taung-Tha-Man Lake is one of the main tourist attractions for visitors and it is the longest teak bridge in the world. "Silk Weaving Industry" Myanmar's traditional and hand making. After that, proceed to Mandalay sightseeing, "Mahamuni Pagoda" the great facial of Buddha and it was brought to Mandalay from Rakhine State during the reign of King Bodawpaya in 1784. The image is completely covered with 15cm thick gold. "Gold Leaf Making Workshop" you can see how to make gold leaf. The square gold leaf tissues are hand-made in Mandalay. Furniture, shrines, boxes, musical instruments etc are usually covered with gilded relief patterns. "Shwe Nan Daw Monastery" a superb example of an ancient traditional wooden building with intricate carvings. "Kuthodaw Pagoda" make of marble and the "World' s Largest Book" is a 13-acre field of 729 pieces of stone on marble slabs. "Mandalay Hill" A superb panoramic view of the city can be seen from the top Sunset and overview of Mandalay city. After sightseeing, transfer to hotel. Overnight at hotel in Mandalay











After breakfast at hotel, transfer to the airport for morning flight to Heho.

From Heho, a scenic one-hour drive leads to Nyaung Shwe, the gateway village to Inle Lake. Upon reaching the edges of Inle Lake, board a private motorboat to head out to Inle Lake, one of Myanmar's most spectacular sights. Pass villages built on stilts over the lake, inhabited by the local Intha people. Observe the leg-rowing fishermen and see their floating gardens built up from strips of water hyacinth and mud and anchored to the bottom with bamboo poles. Visit Nga Hpe Chaung Monastery, which houses dozens of Shan Buddha Images, but is more famous for its unique 'jumping cats' who jump through hoops in the air! Continue to Phaung Daw Oo Pagoda, the lake's main sanctuary, which contains five sacred Buddha images covered in gold leaf.

Explore the local crafts of Inle Lake with a stop at the weaving village of Inpawkhone and a cheroot factory, where the typical Burmese cigars are made by hand. If time permits, there may be time to enjoy a short walk through one of the lakeside villages. Overnight at hotel in Nyaung Shwe (On the Land).

Day 5: Heho (Inle Lake)- Yangon

(Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner)







After breakfast, explore the southern part of the lake by boat sailing through small twisting and turning creeks to reach Indein village. This small village located on the southwestern bank of the lake is famous for its ruined clusters of pagodas dating back to the 16th-century. After that transfer to then transfer to Airport for flight to Yangon. Arrive Yangon and transfer to hotel check in. Dinner at local restaurant and

overnight in Yangon.

## Day 6 : Yangon departure (Breakfast)

After breakfast at hotel, transfer to Yangon and transfer to airport for departure to your next destination. Meals included: Breakfast
