Day 1 Arrive Auckland

On arrival at Auckland Airport you will be met and transferred to your hotel.

Day 2 Auckland - Whitianga, Coromandel (189 km)

Travel along the Seabird Coast to Miranda Shorebird Centre, home to many migatory birds. The Pacific Coast Highway leads you to the Coromandel Peninsula, renowned for its spectacular coastline and white sandy beaches. On reaching Thames, meander through Rapaura Watergardens abundant with native birds and bush all interspersed with garden art. In historic Coromandel Town ride aboard the narrow gauge train at Driving Creek Railway on a unique journey up steep grades, across trestle bridges, along spirals, through tunnels and replanted native kauri forest. Continue on to your accommodation.

Day 3 Coromandel

Renowned worldwide for its natural beauty - misty rainforests and pristine golden beaches, The Coromandel is blessed with hundreds of natural hideaways, making it an ideal place to slow down, relax and unwind.

Enjoy the Coromandel scenery and beaches today. At Hot Water Beach an underground river of hot water flows from the interior of the earth to surface in the Pacific Ocean. Paddle your feet or soak in the natural hot water pools dug in the sand beside the ocean (tides permitting).
