- **Get to know:** Culture, History, Local living of people in Yangon City, Bago, Kyaikhtiyo City and Thanlyin City. Enjoy Myanmar Cuisine. Firstly, Yangon (formerly known as Rangoon) is the largest city in Myanmar (formerly Burma). A mix of British colonial architecture, modern high-rises and gilded Buddhist pagodas define its skyline. Its famed Shwedagon Paya, a huge, shimmering pagoda complex, draws thousands of pilgrims annually. The city's other notable religious sites include the Botataung and Sule pagodas, both housing Buddhist relics. Secondly, Discover Bagan is an ancient city in central Myanmar (formerly Burma), southwest of Mandalay. Standing on the eastern banks of the Ayeyarwady River, it's known for the Bagan Archaeological Area, where more than 2,000 Buddhist monuments tower over green plains. Holy sites around Old Bagan include ornate Ananda Temple, built in 1091 and topped with a golden stupa. Nearby is the vast 12th-century Dhammayangyi Temple. Finally, explore Mandalay is a city and former royal capital in northern Myanmar (formerly Burma) on the Irrawaddy River. In its center is the restored Mandalay Palace from the Konbaung Dynasty, surrounded by a moat. Mandalay Hill provides views of the city from its summit, which is reached by covered stairway. At its foot, the Kuthodaw Pagoda houses hundreds of Buddhist-scripture-inscribed marble slabs.

**SIGHTSEEINGS:**



**Shwedagon Pagoda:** is the most sacred and impressive Buddhist site for the people of the Union of Myanmar. Shwedagon Pagoda is covered with hundreds of gold plates and the top of the stupa is encrusted with 4531 diamonds; the largest of which is a 72 carat diamond. It is clearly one of the wonders of the religious world. The Buddhist site forms the focus of religious as well as community activities: bustling of devotees, monks washing statues, offering flowers, worshipping and meditating



**Sule Pagoda:** is an important Yangon landmark. Smack right in the centre of a busy commercial district, on the thoroughfare between two major roads, Sule Pagoda has historical and cultural significance. The temple is believed to have been built during the time of the Buddha Guatama and is therefore more than 2,500 years old. It contains a single hair relic of the Buddha.



**Kaba Aye Pagoda:** mostly known as "World Peace Pagoda" was built in 1952 and was built to commemorate the Sixth Buddha Synod in 1954.



**Chauk Htat Gyi Pagoda:** an image of a reclining Buddha , 216ft in length and it is the third largest reclining Buddha in Myanmar. One significant thing is that, the eyes of this Buddha are made of glass and look like real human eyes. Chauk Htat Gyi reclining Buddha is the most elegant reclining Buddha image in the world.



**Bogyoke Aung San Market (formerly Scott's Market):** is a major bazaar located in Pabedan township in central Yangon, Myanmar. Known for its colonial architecture and inner cobblestone streets, the market is a major tourist destination, dominated by antique, Burmese handicraft and jewellery shops, art galleries, and clothing stores.



**Nyaung U Market** is a local market in the village of Nyaung U to the northeast of Bagan. A bustling river town with more action than is on offer elsewhere in Bagan, Nyaung U is where most independent travellers hang their hat (or backpack). The Nyaung U Market provides great photo opportunity, and also the chance for tourists to mingle with the local Myanmar people, and watch how they conduct their daily lives. The market is divided into different sections selling different items, and includes a wet market. There is a section selling rattan items, another selling tealeaves - a delicacy in Myanmar, yet another selling clothes.



**Htilominlo Temple** is a Buddhist temple located in Bagan, in Burma/Myanmar, built during the reign of King Htilominlo, 1211-1231. The temple is three stories tall, with a height of 46 metres, and built with red brick.



**The Ananda temple** is one of Bagan's best known and most beautiful temples. It was one of the first great temples to be built in Bagan and is well preserved. The temple is found near the Tharabar gate, the only gate remaining of the original 12 in the old Bagan city walls.



**Dhammayangyi Temple** is a Buddhist temple located in Bagan, Myanmar. Largest of all the temples in Bagan, the Dhammayan as it is popularly known was built during the reign of King Narathu.



**Thatbyinnyu Temple**, Sabbannu or "the Omniscient", is a famous temple located in Bagan, built in the mid-12th century during the reign of King Alaungsithu. It is adjacent to Ananda Temple.



**The Maha Myat Muni Pagoda** located in southwest Mandalay, also referred to as Mahamuni Pagoda, is considered one of most venerated images for the Buddhists in Myanmar and nearby countries. Maha Muni is the holiest pagoda of Mandalay and considered the second holiest place in Myanmar just after Shwedagon Pagoda in Yangon.





**The Shwenandaw Monastery** is one of the finest examples of traditional 19<sup>th</sup> century wooden monastery building in the country. The monastery that is also known as the Shwenandaw Kyaung is a very finely carved teak wooden monastery building just outside the Mandalay Royal Palace, on the same grounds as the Atumashi Monastery. The monastery is also called the Golden Palace Monastery, because it used to be part of the Mandalay Royal Palace and was completely gilded. Both exterior and interior of the monastery are decorated with intricate wood carvings.



**The Atumashi Monastery** is a Buddhist monastery located in Mandalay, Myanmar. It was built in 1857 by King Mindon, two years after the capital was moved to Mandalay. The monastery was built at a cost of 500,000 rupees.



**Mandalay Hill** which summit is 230 m above the surrounding plain is the natural watch-tower for the visitors to watch sunrise or sunset over the city plains. Every one who arrived in Mandalay, the ancient capital of Myanmar, usually goes to Mandalay Hill, the landmark of Mandalay, which overlooks the city. At the bottom in front of the southwest entrance are the two immense statue of Lions guard the holy hill.

**DAY 02: YANGON  BAGAN BY FLIGHT (EXLUDED AIRFARE) **

After breakfast at hotel, transfer to YANGON airport for **flight to Bagan**. Morning arrival Bagan, visit by car to see *Nyaung U Market*, *Shwezigone Pagoda* in which an emerald image of the Buddha from China and the Frontlet Relic of Buddha were enshrined, *Htitlominlo Pagoda* one of the largest temples of **Bagan**. Lunch at local restaurant. Then visit to noted for its fine plaster carvings *Ananda Temple*, the finest, largest and best preserved of all the **Bagan** temples and *Dhammayangyi Pagoda*, extending approximately 255 feet on each of its four sides, is Bagan’s most massive shrine, *Thatbyinyu Pagoda*. Overnight at Bagan.

After breakfast at hotel, morning drive by CAR **5 hours** drive to Mandalay. Arrival Mandalay visit in Mandalay city area, sightseeing city tour including a visit to *Mahar Myat Muni Pagoda*, the most ancient Buddha image casted in bronze in Myanmar, *Shwenandaw Monastery* a significant masterpiece of the wood-carver’s art, Mandalay *Golden palace* the first palace to be built in Myanmar by King Mindon. After lunch, continue visit to gold leaf beating workshop, *Atumashi Monastery* a huge grandiose structure surrounded by five graduated rectangular terraces, and *Mandalay Hill* for enjoy sunset. Overnight in Mandalay.

Then Yangon city tour, visit to *Chauk Htat Gyi Pagoda* to see a huge reclining Buddha image, *Sule Pagoda*, *City Hall*, *Maharbandoola Garden*, complete your first day in Myanmar with an extended visit to one of the world's most spectacular monuments the *Shwedagon Pagoda*; its golden stupa is the heart of Myanmar. The pagoda is believed 2,500 years old and the central stupa in surrounded by dozens of intricately decorated buildings and statues. There are always many Myanmar people praying and making offering at Pagoda. Evening back to your hotel and overnight.
